That the proper City officials are hereby authorized to execute a contract with the Perth Amboy Uniformed Fire Fighters Association, Local No. 286, Affiliated with the I.A.F.F., A.F.L.-C.I.O. which reflects modifications to the Contract ending December 31, 2018, as set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement referred to herein, for the new contract period of January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2022.

# MMEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PERTH AMBOY AND PERTH AMBOY UNIFORMED FIRE FIGHTERS ASSOCIATION AND LOCAL 286, IAFF

- 1. Duration: January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2022.
- 2. January 1, 2019 eliminate current step one on guide 3 and current step 2 becomes step one on guide 3. Steps renumbered accordingly.
- Add new step onto guide 3 between current FF 1<sup>st</sup> grade step 9 and senior FF 1 step 10, which shall be the mid-point between those steps in 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022.
- Firefighters continue to move through the steps on their anniversary date.
   2018 salary guide shall increase by 1.5% retroactive to January 1, 2019.
- 5. January 1, 2020 1.5% across the board increase. Firefighters continue to move through the steps on their anniversary date.
- 6. January 1, 2021 1.5% across the board increase. Firefighters continue to move through the steps on their anniversary date.
- 7. January 1, 2022 1.5% across the board increase. Firefighters continue to move through the steps on their anniversary date.
- 8. Add the following language to the CNA: If the City offers the IAFF a reasonable number of negotiation dates prior to June 1, 2022 and negotiations do not commence prior to June 1st, post expiration increments where due shall not be paid until a new CNA is executed.
- 9. All executed "TOK'S" shall be part of this MOA and deemed part of the CNA.

  All proposals not included herein are deemed withdrawn.

This memorandum of agreement is subject to ratification by the respective parties.

The negotiators for these parties agree to recommend the ratification of this MOA.

Arbitrator Ira Cure shall retain jurisdiction of this matter in the event either party fails to ratify this agreement.

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable, and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase hereof shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

**SECTION 4.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
